#### 1. Personal profile

I was born in London, England on 10<sup>th</sup> November 1956.

Vessel refloated, Orinoco

I went to sea aged 16, and then spent 21 years sailing on deep-sea, commercial vessels, which included 5 years in command, world-wide.

Whilst at sea, I served on tankers and bulk carriers of all sizes, plus an assortment of general cargo, and container carrying vessels, plus some short sea trade vessels.

After leaving the sea, I spent 9 years with the leading International London maritime law firm, Clyde + Co. working as an investigator, casehandler, and in-house consultant.

In 2004, I jointly set up Marine Professionals, which specialises in independent Casualty Investigation and Marine Consultancy, across a wide spectrum of marine-related matters.

I have advised insurers and assureds on Risk Assessment; Operational Management; Reporting Systems; Emergency Response; Salvage; SCOPIC, Casualty Management; and Wreck Removal.

I also provide forensic, desk-top, analysis of existing claims, reviewing evidence and reports, developing tactics and strategies, and advising clients on the way forward.

I work mainly for H+M, Liability, War, K+R, P+I, and cargo insurers, plus their brokers and adjusters, as well as for ship owners and charterers.

Through the combination of my sea-going experience and the investigation and assessment of a broad range of marine claims, I am able to advise upon the evidential issues involved in assessing and establishing liability, and the pursuit of recovery actions against third parties. I am also able to advise and act upon the most appropriate and effective methods of obtaining evidence, the sources, standards, and quality of evidence required and how to gather, preserve, and analyse evidence within the applicable legal framework.

As a result, I am able to assist clients to formulate and develop strategies geared towards negotiated settlements and mediation of disputes.

#### 2. Services

**2.1.** Lloyd's Special Casualty Representative ("SCR")

On Lloyds approved SCR Panel (of 50 persons, world-wide), authorised to attend major casualties under Lloyd's Open Form of Salvage Agreement ("no cure no pay"), and the SCOPIC clause, acting on behalf of international property and liability interests.

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# 2.2. Casualty management

Emergency 24 hour response, investigation, and on-site liaison with salvors, contractors, local authorities, officials, surveyors, technicians, experts, and lawyers; plus I have worked on several wreck removals.

# 2.3. Investigation

I basically provide "Liability Investigation" and advice on causation, liability, and quantum on all types of marine-related insurance claims, disputes, (and potential disputes), including; collision; allision; grounding; fire and explosion; engine, steering and machinery breakdowns; deck machinery and crane failures; major cargo losses, damage and contamination; tug operation, towage and salvage; personal injury; ship and port ISPS security; piracy, (Somalia and West Africa); phantom ship and fraud; wind turbines; car-carriers; super/mega yacht; pollution and oil spill response; and third party liabilities, as well as investigating the human factors, and root cause analysis of casualties, and numerous unseaworthiness issues.

## 2.4. Other investigations

I have investigated and advised on numerous and various, charterparty disputes, including cargo stowage, securing, and lashing; draught surveys, stability and squat; safe port/safe berth liabilities; lay-time; navigation; passage planning; tug and Pilot issues, and the Master-Pilot relationship; speed/consumption claims; plus other contract-related problems associated with ship building; dry-docking and painting; ship repair disputes; as well as bunker/fuel/lub arguments.

# 2.5. Desk-top forensic analysis

I carry out desk-top forensic analysis of established claims, to review the facts, evidence and reports, and advise on the additional evidence required, and possibly how to obtain it; plus identify and locate potential witnesses; and recommend on how to progress with the claim.

I have drilled down into ISM, ISPS, VDR/sVDR, Planned Maintenance, and ECDIS systems, analysing the information and data on who did what, when, where, and particularly, why.

I advise on third party recovery actions.

I have been both witness of fact and acted as an expert witness, working with local and international lawyers and adjusters in the English, South African High Courts, and in London Arbitration, bringing and defending actions.

## 2.6. Dispute Avoidance

I have been involved in formulating and developing strategies and advising clients on the way forward and ways to settle and avoid disputes and litigation.

## 2.7. <u>Risk Assessment</u>

I have carried out pre-risk surveys and follow-up audits of ports; terminals; fleets; plus provided focussed marine consultancy on unique, untried and innovative, marine-related projects.

## 2.8. International Presentations
